Mr. Donabedian is Managing Principal of Winston Investment Management, Inc., Cincinnati, Ohio.

He also serves as Chairman of Globili, Inc., an early stage technology company based in Cincinnati

Prior to establishing his own company, Mr. Donabedian was President and CEO of USF&G Marketing Services Company, Inc. where he was responsible for new product development, and had five affiliated companies reporting to him.

Other past boards included Reading & Bates, Houston, TX, (NYSE-RB), the Flex-Funds, a privately held mutual fund management company located in Columbus, Ohio. He served as Chairman of the Audit Committee and the Strategic Planning Committee. He is also a past trustee of another mutual fund organization, The Premier Portfolios, where he served as Chairman of that group's Audit Committee as well.

Mr. Donabedian stepped down from corporate boards, to spend more time on his personal interests and charities.

He is a past Trustee of the Cincinnati Council on World Affairs, a past director the American Cancer Society, and a past Trustee of the Kelly Clark Foundation.
